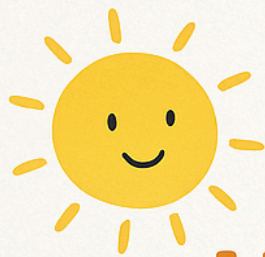

- Daily Newspaper: Develop the Habit of Newspaper Reading. Write down 10 new words you learn from the newspaper and use each one in a sentence.

### **3. Family Moments – Bond and Bloom**

Assist your family member with a task.

Spend quality time with your family—play a game, cook together, share stories, or plant something.

Write about a special moment or paste a photo (optional).

Show Gratitude to your family - Create a gratitude list by making a list of 5 things you are thankful to your family for.

Give a thankyou note to your family members whenever you take help from them.

**4. Current Affairs -** Choose a News topic, research and summarize it, and then reflect and present your opinion.

### **5. Working Model Challenge – *Create with Your Hands***

Make a simple working model. (Any 1 of your choice).

**Ideas:**

#### **♦ 3D Map of India with Cultural Highlights**

Create a raised map showing major Indian states with miniature representations of famous landmarks (e.g., Taj Mahal, Charminar), dances (e.g., Kathakali in Kerala), and foods.

#### **♦ Monument Working Light Model**

Create a miniature of a monument (e.g., Qutub Minar) that lights up using LEDs to show it in a night view.

#### **♦ Sustainable India – Smart Village Model**

Showcase a self-sufficient Indian village with solar panels, water harvesting, organic farming.



♦ **Folk Dances of India Carousel**

*A rotating wheel displaying puppets or figures dressed in traditional dance costumes.*

♦ **Incredible India Travel Cube**

*A cube with 6 sides – each showcasing a different region of India with landmarks, food, languages.*

♦ **Festival Celebration Model**

*A scene depicting Holi, Diwali, Eid, or Onam – showing traditional clothing, activities, food.*

♦ **Mini Bharat Darshan Train**

*of trains on a circular track with coaches labeled with Indian states and showing their specialities.*

### **Math**

### **Science**

Explore Biodiversity Hotspots: Study the flora and fauna of India's biodiversity hotspots such as Western Ghats or the Himalayas and present the findings using scrapbook.

### **Social Studies**

On a map of India, **mark the locations of major National Parks and Wildlife Sanctuaries**. Also, mention the **specific animals or birds** that each park is known for.

### **English**

Research and write **interesting anecdotes or fascinating facts** about India's natural sites—maybe a surprising story about the Himalayas, or a fun fact about the Sundarbans!

### **Hindi**

Write a few **folk tales or folk songs** that are connected to **India's rivers or mountains**. These could be traditional stories passed down through generations or songs sung by local communities.
